It is with great pleasure that I present some news on the growth of SightLife and the Northwest Lions Foundation for the 1st Quarter 2019.

SightLife continues serving the Pacific Northwest with outstanding service and has reached incredible growth providing tissue for over 3,253 corneal transplants this first quarter of 2019. This is an amazing 45% increase from the same period last year. New recovery contracts have been established from Hawaii to Boston.

The Northwest Lions Foundation Board of Trustees continues to work on expanding our Health Screening Programs. Our mini- screening program has expanded to five units, in addition to our large screening unit. We now have just over 100 Lion members trained to provide screening services. We have lost our driver of the large LHSU. We urge all Lions in MD-19 to help in our recruitment of a new driver with a CDL drivers license. This can be a part-time position. We continue to grow our mini-screening units. These units are operated by local Lions Clubs.

We are pleased to announce that we are now using new state of the art digital aids in The Foundation's hearing program for low-income people.
