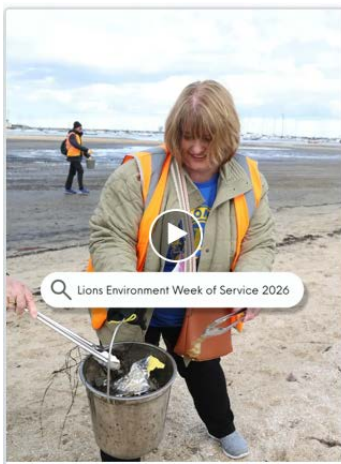

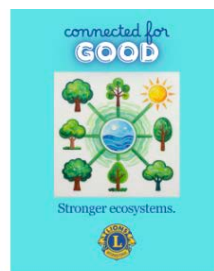

Group Activities for Earth Week

Here are some simple group activities you can do for Earth Week:

- Neighborhood or park clean-up: pick a spot, bring gloves and bags, and spend an hour collecting litter together.
 - Group walk/bike day: choose one day where everyone avoids driving and walks, bikes, or takes transit.
 - Power-down hour: pick a time where everyone turns off non-essential electronics.
 - Plant something together: could be a small garden, balcony plants, or even indoor herbs.
 - DIY eco workshop: make things like beeswax wraps, simple compost bins, or natural cleaners.
 - Share one habit each person will keep: at the end of the week, everyone commits to one small change.

'On-Your-Own' Activities for Earth Week

Here are some simple, realistic things you can do on your own for Earth Week – just small actions that actually add up:

- Use less water, take shorter showers, turn off the tap while brushing your teeth
- Bring a reusable bag or bottle instead of single-use plastic
- Eat one plant-based meal a day (or even just for the week)
- Walk, bike, or take public transit instead of driving (even once or twice helps)
- Carpool if you can
- Pick up litter in your neighborhood or a nearby park
- Recycle properly (check your local rules—many people get this wrong!)
- Compost food scraps if your area supports it
- Plant something (even herbs on a windowsill)
